Grimshaw appointed to design Europe's largest technology innovation centre at Here East

ENTIQ, the innovation delivery and business accelerator specialists and DV4, Delancey's evergreen investment fund, have selected Grimshaw to design Europe's largest innovation centre at Here East, London's 1.2 million square foot digital and creative campus on the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park. This centre will bring together a community of small and big businesses that will build connected products that will improve people's lives, with an initial focus on sport, health, fashion, design and the Internet of Things (IoT).

Grimshaw and ENTIQ are working together to ensure that this new technology innovation centre is in line with the legacy of a very successful Olympic Games. The new centre will be designed with sustainability, adaptability and wellbeing foremost in mind, and will act as a dynamic tool for growth in east London while creating a new tech hub for the UK.

After a competitive selection process, Grimshaw was chosen for a design approach that looks to the future of the creative workplace, with adaptive modular environments and flexible space distribution. The practice's vision for the centre includes an 'eco-system' of spaces that are permeable and flexible, responding to the needs of the innovative corporate companies and start-ups it will house.

Urban design provides inspiration for the emerging plan for the centre, with public squares and spaces to gather, collaborate, relax and reflect. With a focus on increasing collaboration, the design will allow areas of the building to expand, contract and change on demand, with orchestrated pathways through the centre to ensure there are ample opportunities for the exchange of ideas. The centre will act as a testing ground for the production and demonstration of these ideas, turning them into functional and essential products for daily living.

The design for the centre will allow users to customise their own spaces with components they can create themselves in the building's own workshop. The Maker's Lab is set to become an integral part of the centre, and as a source of production and prototyping it will provide the centre's occupants with the tools and technologies to transform their ideas into products. The Lab will also provide prototype creation capabilities for the building itself; enabling innovators to design and build items ranging from bespoke chairs to furniture components, shelves to light fittings.

Throughout the design and delivery of the fit-out, Grimshaw's ambition is to work with a range of smaller suppliers and materials manufacturers. The ethos of collaboration, and of large and small businesses working together will be cemented in the design process of the centre even before the first innovator has moved in.

Grimshaw Partner, Jolyon Brewis said, "We are thrilled to be chosen to design this visionary project which will accelerate London's position as a world-leading

technology hub. The project brings together our thinking on urban design, architecture and product design to create a unique environment for innovation."

This is critically important to this architectural endeavour as we transform the Olympic Press and Broadcast Centre on the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park into a thriving technology, business and innovation cluster, which serves the unique and dynamic needs of its members."

The centre will run programmes and activities throughout 2016, with a soft launch event planned for October. It will officially open in January 2017.
